Subject: "Can we Give God Anything"

A study of the Grain Offering

Reading: Leviticus 2

- 1. Notice that the grain offering was in three forms:
  - (a) Grain offered to the Lord in the form of fine flour (1:1-3)
  - (b) Grain offered to the Lord in the form of cakes; baked, grilled, or pan fried (1:4-11)
  - (c) Grain offered to the Lord in the form of the green ear of new grain, roasted in the fire
- 2. How does God manage to have a second offering if the first gave Him everything? It was an offering connected with first fruits which although a tribute, is called in Hebrew 'Minchah' (a gift). Aren't there times when you want to give to the Lord for the sheer joy of it?
- The New Testament application is just thrilling; 1 Corinthians 15:20-23: Romans 8:23.
- 4. The grain offering speaks of the Lord Jesus:
  - (a) The grain speaks of the body of the Lord Jesus; He had a perfect body.
  - (b) The oil speaks of spirit; he had an unfallen spirit.
  - (c) The frankincense speaks of his loveliness; He was all for God. Notice all of the frankincense in the grain offering was to be given.
- 5. How does the grain offering apply to us?:
  - (a) Christ will redeem our body (flour) 1 Corinthians 15.
  - (b) Christ will renew our "inner man" (oil) Ephesians 3:16.
  - (c) Christ will give us opportunity to give Him that which is particularly pleasing to God (frankincense) Psalm 69:30-31; Isaiah 1:12-18.
  - (d) Christ will aid us through the heat of life with the covenant of His promise (salt) Romans 8:28.
