Subject: 'Healing from a Distance' (John 4:46-54)

- 1. The three main questions raised in this story:
- a) A question of signs (v43-48).
- b) A question of believing. Notice the nobleman believed twice (v50 and v53 cf. Romans 5:1-4). It is the progression of faith.
- c) A question of timing (v50 and v52). Christ is the Lord of time and space.
- 2. The Lord's strange response: why did He talk theology (v48) when the nobleman was in deep distress with his boy on the point of death? It was a question of delayed evidence (Jn. 20:31; John 2:19-22). The Lord shows the nobleman that he will know no peace of mind unless he takes His word without any immediate evidence. The evidence would come later.
- 3. A word to fathers. The nobleman's behaviour is a fine example of a role-model of good parenting:
- a) A faithful father isn't too independent to admit his needs.
- b) A faithful father isn't too busy to know his children.
- c) A faithful father isn't too proud to believe God's Word.
- d) A faithful father isn't too logical to walk by faith.
- e) A faithful father isn't too serious to enjoy life with his family.
