"The Tongue"

An exposition of James 3:2-12

Subject: "How to Stop a Keen sense of Rumour"

TUESDAY, JANUARY 9th, 1990

- 1. The tongue is an incredibly influential force (James 3: 1-5a):—
 - (a) For evil. The crime sheets of the tongue includes: Dishonesty. Unkindness. Flattery. Impurity. Blasphemy. Pride. Criticism. Exaggeration. Temper. Greed. Slander. Boasting.
 - (b) For good. The tongue under the Holy Spirit's control can be used to communicate; Encouragement. Love. Comfort. Wisdom. Inspiration. The Gospel. Praise. Blessing.
- 2. The tongue can be an incredibly raging fire (James 3: 5b-6). Notice that James points out:—
 - (a) The potential of the tongue; "A world of iniquity".
 - (b) The stain of the tongue's pollution; "It defiles the whole body".
 - (c) The sphere of the tongue's penetration; "It sets the whole course of life on fire".
 - (d) The source of the tongue's power; "It is set on fire by hell".
- 3. The flame of rumour and how to stop it:—
 - (a) Identify sources by name.
 - (b) Support evidence with facts.
 - (c) Ask the person "May I quote you?".
 - (d) Openly admit that you don't appreciate hearing rumours.
- 4. The humanly untameable tongue (James 3: 7-10):—
 - (a) It is capable of terrible injury; "Full of deadly poison".
 - (b) It is capable of treacherous inconsistency; "It praises God and curses men".
- 5. The key to better communication is to be a good listener and then to let your tongue be a fountain of life rather than a babbling brook (Proverbs 10: 11). See back page for the Ten Commandments for Better Listening.
